The purpose of this monthly page in the Parish Magazine is to offer different ways of relieving the burden of life, ways of releasing us from fear and insecurity, doorways to joy.

Does that sound like a bit of a tall order?

Let's put it another way. This page doesn't alter your own life-situation, or the conditions in which you live. That is the pattern of your own life. But it does point to ways of responding to what happens. It's not the world 'out there' we are discussing; it's the world in your head.

It's not events in your life that cause you to suffer; it's how you respond to those events.

This is a physical world where pain and suffering arise in different forms. Painful circumstances keep on coming – from one end of the spectrum, what seems unbearable torment, to minor irritation at the other end.

But the world is secondary. Your state of mind is primary.

How do you achieve an unshakeable consciousness that cannot be made distraught by life? Answer: stop mental story-telling, stop thinking wasteful repetitive negative thoughts, stop repeating the story behind your resentment and anger. Be still. Hold the attention in the here and now. Bring the circular thinking to a standstill.

Allow events to be what they are. Accept reality. Don't resist what is fact and true and real – even when it is incomprehensible, when it affects you deeply. Mysteries surround us. Other people are on life-paths different to yours. Do not be afraid of suffering, others' or your own.

It sometimes takes a big heart to accept and allow events. Appearances are not the whole picture. Look at life from inner stillness, not from emotional reactivity.

Nothing lasts. This world is mutable and fleeting. Every storm blows itself out and runs out of rain. Hold to the one eternal constant in life: your consciousness and the doorway it holds to inner peace.




